Language

A <u>possessive pronoun</u> shows ownership. It takes the place of a possessive noun.

A possessive noun <u>does not</u> have an apostrophe: my, your, his, her, its, our, their

Possessive pronouns must match the nouns they replace in number and gender: It is <u>Tim's</u> bag. It is <u>his</u> bag.

A stand-alone possessive pronoun is not used directly before a noun: yours, hers, ours, and theirs. Most are formed by adding —s. Mine is a stand-alone possessive pronoun.
