Language

A **possessive pronoun** shows ownership. It takes the place of a possessive noun.

A possessive noun **does not** have an apostrophe: my, your, his, her, its, our, their

Possessive pronouns must match the nouns they replace in number and gender: It is Tim's bag. It is his bag.

A stand-alone possessive pronoun is not used directly before a noun: yours, hers, ours, and theirs. Most are formed by adding -s. Mine is a stand-alone possessive pronoun.
